Who should be contacted if...

Q: ... my child has experienced violence, intimidation, or any other major/ongoing conflict with at least one other student?

A: Homeroom teacher, student advisor, or school counselor

Q: ... my child is struggling emotionally?

A: Student advisor or school counselor

Q: ... my child is struggling behaviourally?

A: Student advisor or school counselor

Q: ... my child is struggling socially?

A: Homeroom teacher, student advisor, or school counselor

Q: ... my child is struggling in a particular subject?

A: Subject teacher

Q: ... my child is struggling in multiple subjects?

A: Homeroom teacher or student advisor

Q: ... a classmate's behaviour has been bothering my child (e.g. asking to copy their homework) and they've already asked them to stop?

Q: ... my child is having a problem with a teacher and they've already spoken to the teacher?

Step 3: Student advisor

Q: ... an issue that affects more than one class arises? (e.g. a problem created by a new school policy).

Step 1: Student body rep

Step 2: Student advisor

Q: ... my child has an idea that could improve life at AvH?

A: Student body rep

Q: ... I have questions concerning my child's IEP or support plan?

A: Student learning enrichment coordinator

Q: ... I have questions concerning the Quebec diploma, Abitur, AP tests, post-secondary studies, or studying abroad?

A: Academic counselor
