



German International Abitur

AvH is the only German International school in Canada offering the prestigious German International Abitur (DIA - Grade 12). It is the highest diploma awarded to secondary school students at German schools abroad and in Germany.

AvH students take the DES (Secondary School Diploma) and continue the DIA (Deutsches Internationales Abitur) preparation in grade 11.

The major differences are listed below:

University	 With CÉGEP, diploma, students can study in Quebec or elsewhere in Canada. To obtain an undergraduate academic degree (B.A.), a 3-year program of studies is generally required. A Cégep diploma may be recognized internationally but the process is not as straightforward as with the German International Abitur. 	 With the DIA diploma, students may attend university and obtain their B.A. or B.S. Degree. In Quebec, 3 or 4 years (including a year 0) are required depending on the faculty. Elsewhere in Canada, 3 to 4 years are required, depending on the faculty . In Germany and worldwide generally in a 3-year study program.
